## Malloy, Orlowski run to victory

---

Chad Malloy knows all too well how seconds count.

The **Springville** runner pulled out another close win at Saturday's JFK Invitational. Malloy ran the 2.5-mile course in 12 minutes, 26.83 seconds to out-lean Cole Townsend of **Canisius**, who finished in 12:26.93.

Malloy had a similar finish last year at this event, edging out **St. Joe's** Quincy O'Connor by two-tenths of a second. The third annual event drew a field of 21 boys teams and 13 girls on a near-perfect day for a run.



In the girls race, **East Aurora** freshman Marta McLaughlin fought off Penfield's Leila Mantilla to win in 14:20.15.

The East Aurora girls had two others finish among the top 10: Sarah Mars (seventh) and Sarah Anstett (eighth). **Starpoint** had two top 10 finishers thanks to Amy Cooper (fifth) and Livia Chase (sixth).

The East Aurora boys and girls defended their team titles. The boys scored 57 points to edge Canisius (66) and St. Joe's (72).

EA's girls scored 43 points, bettering runner-up Penfield with 60 and **Orchard Park** with 82.

**Byron-Bergen Invitational:** Nick Orlowski broke the course record, running a 15:50 to win the Kota-Reis XC Invitational held at Robbins Brook Park in Bergen. The **Alden** senior's race strategy was to maintain a 5:15-mile pace for himself.

"He's been training all summer, been running a lot at Chestnut Ridge and is really taking it seriously this year, and he looks great," said Alden coach Ed Carll. "We go to West Seneca next week. He'll be tested there."

The **Williamsville North** girls team won the team title with 32 points as they were one point better than Mercy of Rochester. Danielle Dorogi of the Spartans was runner-up in 20:27.

North's boys finished third led by Carl Copeland's 17:07.
