

Dunkirk runs past ALCS, 89-51

Delgado took first in the 100-meter dash, crossing the finish line in :12.4 while helping the 4x100 relay team to a first-place finish. The quartet finished the event in :46.9. Marshall took first in both the long and triple jump events, finishing at 19-feet 7-inches and 41-5, respectively.

Other winners for the Marauders included Chris Gajewski in the 800 (2:21.6) and Calvin Stallworth in the high jump (5-8).

Jeff Elwell was a double winner for the Gators, finishing first in the 1,600 (5:17.1) and 3,200 (12:23.6).

In the girl's meet, Allegany-Limestone defeated Dunkirk 95-40. The Lady Marauders only received three first place finishes.

The 3200 meter relay of Calan Pogorzelski, Luisa Bonilla, Rachel Rosas and Amanda Michalski won in a time of 11:20. Michalski also placed first in the triple jump with a distance of 30'5".

Lisa Dunbar won the pole vault with a jump of 7'6".

Fredonia drops Gowanda, falls to Falconer

FALCONER - Fredonia ran a dual meet Monday, defeating Gowanda 98-43, but falling to Falconer 80-61.

Against Gowanda, Fredonia's Dylan Cassidy was a triple winner. He took first in the 200 (23.8), 400 hurdles (57.5) and the high jump (5'6"). His time in the 400 hurdles qualified him for sectionals.

Tyler Cassidy was a double winner, taking first in the 800 (2:11.3) and 1600 (4:48.9).

Matt Civilette won the triple jump with a sectional qualifying jump of 40'7".

The Panthers had two athletes qualify for sectionals. Christian Igelinski ran the 110 high hurdles in 16.5 seconds and Marcus Hoffman pole vaulted 12 feet.

Jared Bogardus was the lone double winner for Gowanda, taking first in the 100 (12.0) and the shot put (36' 6 1/4").

Against Falconer, Dylan Cassidy was a quadruple winner, adding the 110 high hurdles (16.7) to his previous three.

The Golden Falcons had two double winners. Howard tenPass took first in the shot put (41' 8 1/4") and the discus (109' 9 3/4"). James Haveron won the 100 (11.8) and qualified for sectionals with his time of 53 seconds in the 400.



Fredonia drops pair of meets at Falconer

Emily Steves and Allison Thompson were double winners as Gowanda dropped Fredonia, 74-66, in CCAA Division 1 girls' track and field action Monday, at Falconer.

Steves took first in the 1,500-meter (5:08) and the 800 (2:35) while Thompson took first in the shotput and discus with respective throws of 27-feet 10-inches and 75-9. Also for Gowanda, Jen Stebbins was first in the 100-meter (:13.9) while helping the 4x100 relay team to a first-place finish in a time of :56.2.

For Fredonia, Nicole Woleben was the bright spot, taking first in the 100 hurdles (:17.7), 400 hurdles (1:16) and the long jump (13-3).

In their match against Falconer, the Lady Hillbillies fell, 99-38, as Lauren Reyda took first in the 3,000 in a time of 11:30 while Briggette Boettcher took first in the pole vault (8-0).
