Sinatra Qualifies For State Indoor Track Meet

FREDONIA - The Jamestown indoor track team competed in the Section 6 State Qualifier Meet on Sunday at Fredonia State and Olivia Sinatra led the way.

Sinatra was second in the 55 hurdles with a personal-best time of 8.84.

That second-place finish makes her the sole JHS athlete to qualify for the state meet at Cornell University next weekend.

Sinatra was also fourth in the pole vault with a height of 9 feet.

Senior Danielle Anderson took fourth in the high jump by clearing the bar at 5-2. Teammates Sydney Pellerito and Brielle Edborg took sixth and ninth with their 4-8 jumps.

Senior Danelle Turney was seventh in the shot put with a throw of 30-8.

Sophomore Cienna Simon was fifth in the 55 hurdles with a personal-best time of 8.99.

The girls 3,200 relay of Haley Kulakowski, Brooke Tobias, Leah Holt and Olivia Zabrodsky broke their own school record by 15 seconds with their patch-winning fourth-place finish in a time of 10:23.24.

The girls 800 relay of Kylie Wilson, Cienna Simon, Maria Liuzzo and Sinatra took third with a season-best time of 1:54.2

For the boys, junior Camryn Knight took fourth in the triple jump with his effort of 41-6.

Junior Taylor Bennett was fifth in the dramatic 600-meter run with a time of 1:27.77. One second separated first to fifth place.

Senior Brandon Delgado was sixth in the 1,000-meter run with a personal-best time of 2:44.57. He also took fifth in the 1,600 in 4:48.04.

Senior Taylor Ordines was fifth in the high jump with a jump of 5-feet-6. Then he has personal bests in the 55 hurdles (9.08) and the long jump (19-8).

Junior David Morse was ninth in the pole vault at 10-6 after having to bow out with a calf injury.

In perhaps the most competitive race of the day, the 1,600 relay team of Taylor Bennett, Dylan Gaeta, Jake Petruccello-Ross and Knight finished second.
