RANDOLPH Jamestown swept both races at the 3.1-mile layout at Randolph in the Chautauqua-Cattaraugus Athletic Conference's cross-country meet.

Brandon Delgado of Jamestown took the boys race with a 19:37.8 as Jamestown took eight of the top 10 positions in having 19 points.

Ripley was second with 94 points, Franklinville scored 101 points and Randolph was incomplete. Hunter Lienhart of Randolph came in second with a 19:40.31.
