Amherst senior Jailyn Twitty broke the Western New York record in the triple jump at Saturday's Team Challenge at Fredonia. Twitty's second of three jumps measured 47 feet, 4 1/2 inches breaking the mark of 47-1 by Austin Price of St. Joe's, set in 2011. Twitty had led Western New York this season at 46 feet, 6 inches.

"He's been close to this record for some time. He went up to Cornell and fouled on some pretty impressive jumps," said Amherst coach Bob LeFauve. "He's developed a different approach mentally toward the event. You can learn the technique, but at some point you have to bring a different game face."

Sweet Home's girls won the team title by two points over Lancaster and Clarence. The Panthers were carried by their depth as hurdlers Sabrina Bush and Stephanie Izard combined to take the team's only first place.

Clarence won the boys team title by eight points over Sweet Home. The Red Devils won the 2-mile relay, mile relay, 1,000 relay and 4x400. Iroquois picked up an impressive win in the 4x200 over Sweet Home.

Lauren Hudson of Williamsville North broke the Spartans' school record in the high jump, clearing 5-5.
