Marshall sets school record in triple jump

The Dunkirk boys' indoor track and field team placed fifth Saturday at the Large School/Small School competition Saturday at the Fredonia State Fieldhouse.

Amherst placed first with 80 points followed by Cheektowaga 63, Iroquois 62, Grand Island 61, Dunkirk 39, Springville 36, Pioneer 31, Allegany/Olean 21, Depew 17, Fredonia 17, Lake Shore 10, West Seneca East 10, Williamsville South 8, Holland 1 and Maryvale 1.

Dunkirk was led by Eddie Marshall as he set a school record in the triple jump at 42-feet-8 1/4 inches, breaking Calvin Stallworth's record of 42-7 set in 2009.

Marshall placed third in the long jump leaping 20-5 3/4.

Tyler Gajewski placed first in the pole vault at 11-6. He placed fifth in the 55-meter hurdles in :8.73. Gajewski anchored the fourth-place 4x200 relay team with John Wentz, Nick Barlette and Vereck Nixon. The 4x400 relay team, consisting of Javier Soto, Zack Meadows, Rashad Graham and Kevin Morales placed fourth at 4:04.3. Morales placed sixth in the 600 (1:35.8). He also led the fifth-place 4x800 relay team with Ethan Francis, Raymond Tarnowski and Tom Logan as they finished in 10:09.8. Soto placed fifth in the 1,000 at 3:03.9.

For Fredonia, Josh Szukala placed first in the 3,200 with a time of 10:19 while Chaz Mancino placed third in the 3,200 with a time of 10:39. He also took sixth in the 1,600 at 5:03.

"He competed in two events and placed in the top six," Fredonia coach Mike Marshall said. "Those are ribbon places. He had a really nice season as far as placing in those two events. It shows all the hard work he has put in."

For the girls, Fredonia's Michaela Tramuta took third in the 3,000 at 11:35. Ally Cobb placed sixth in the high jump with a personal best leap of 4-2.

Devon Cowalewski had a personal best in the long jump at 13-11 3/4. Her previous best was 11-11.

Dunkirk's Calan Porgozelski took fifth in the 1,000 and sixth in the 300 with times of 3:30.6 and :47.6 respectively.

Williamsville South placed first at 107 followed by Grand Island 54, Cheektowaga 47, Amherst 42, Iroquois 36, Springville 36, Maryvale 32, Depew 27, Lake Shore 26, Holland 25, West Seneca East 24, Pioneer 13, Allegany/Olean 12, Fredonia 8 and Dunkirk 3.
