



## **Marshall qualifies for Sectionals at Lancaster**

LANCASTER - Eddie Marshall got off to a strong start in the indoor track and field season as he qualified for Sectionals in the triple jump at the Lancaster Fieldhouse on Friday.

Marshall took first place with a leap of 40-feet-3 3/4 inches to qualify.

"Eddie has the talent coming off of last spring and it was a good way to get started," Dunkirk coach Kurt Warmbrodt said. "All in all, the team did very well. It was a great team effort."

In the shot put, Alex Williams placed second with a throw of 38-11 and Markel Vega took fourth with a heave of 36-3. In the 50 hurdles, Tyler Gajewski placed second with a time of :7.6 and in the 600, Kevin Morales placed third, finishing in 1:38.4. Morales also ran on the third place 4x800 relay team with Javier Soto, Ray Tarnowski and Ethan Francis. The foursome finished the race in 10:13.6.

In the 50, Tyler Crumb finished in 6.5 to place fourth. He also ran on the fourth place 4x200 relay with Morales, Bereck Nickerson and Soto. They finished with a time of 1:52.5.

Calan Pogorzelski had a strong performance for the Lady Marauders as she placed third in the 600 with a time of 1:55.4. She also placed fourth in the 300, finishing with a time of :50.1 and she ran on the third place 4x200 relay team, consisting of Asia Leonard, Bonnie Quatroche and Shadaily Concepcion. They finished at 2:08.6. Concepcion was third in the 50 with a time of 7.5. Quatroche placed third in the long jump with a leap of 11-feet 3/4. In the 1,000, Justice Judkins placed eighth with a time 3:56.9

For the Fredonia Hillbillies, Josh Szukala ran to a first-place finish in the 1,600 run to highlight a strong performance.

Szukala finished the race in 5:03. He also placed second in the 600 with a time of 1:37. Also for the boys, Chaz Mancino took fourth place in the 3,200 with a time of 11:07 and third in the 1,600, finishing at 5:13. Matt Civilette placed second in the triple jump and long jump with leaps of 38-5 inches and 16-6 1/2, respectively.

For the girls, Ally Cobb placed first in the 300 with a time of :49 while Emily Wan placed first in the long jump with a distance of 11-10 1/2. Michaela Tramuta placed fifth in the 1,500 with a time of 5:43 and fourth in the 1,000 with a time of 3:43. Jillian Kowalski took fifth in the 1,000 with a time of 3:46 and Devin Kowalewski jumped 10-5 3/4 to take fifth in the long jump.

"The team put in a strong performance," Fredonia coach Mike Marshall said. "The girls really stepped up and had a good meet. The boys did as expected."
