

## **Eliason, Sherman Girls Earn Invite Firsts**

CUBA - Holly Eliason turned in an outstanding effort in the mud and rain as Sherman won the Small Schools Girls Division at the annual Cuba-Rushford Invitational on Saturday.

Eliason won on the sloppy 3.1-mile layout in the fastest time of the day with a 21:39 as the Lady Wildcats took the crown with 37 points followed by Smethport, Northern Potter, Gowanda and Frewsburg in the 10-team field.

Teammate Rebecca King was second with a 22:25, Katie White 10th, Nicole Damcott 16th, Katie Pacy 18th, Rebekah Anderson 35th and Jaclyn Smith 55th.

Jamestown came in second to powerhouse Northeast in the Large School Boys Division.

Freshman Christian Edborg was seventh with a 19:23.9 while teammate Michael Capestrani was eighth with 19:24.1. Other finishers for Jamestown were Jordan Johnson 11th (19:32), Patrick Walsh 12th (19:36.5) and Michael Johnson 13th (19:47.8).

The Jamestown girls team was without three of its top seven runners because of PSAT, but still managed a fourth-place finish.

Senior captain Haley Kulakowski was 13th with a 24:00.9 while Elizabeth Mazzone 26th with a 25:57.3, Marishka Fadale 27th with a 25:57.9, Rebecca Bogdan 30th with a 26:51.1 and Megan Terry 31st with a 26:56.3.

Back to the Small School Boys Division, Sherman completed a very good day by placing fifth among 10 schools.

Ryan Carpenter led the way with a seventh-place showing (19:21) for the Wildcats.

Trevor Gleason was 15th, Jordan Boland 20th, Nathan Ottaway 41st, Stephen Walzak 69th and Bryan tenPas 80th for Sherman.
