### Foote, Shea run to awards

Senior Aaron Foote of **Niagara-Wheatfield** and senior Jill Shea of **Nardin** were winners of the Robert Murray Award for the fastest times of the day at the Western New York Track and Cross Country Officials Meet at Beaver Island State Park on Grand Island.

The award is named in honor of the cross country coach at Buffalo State from 1956 to 1961. Murray started the meet in 1958, calling it the Buffalo State Invitational.

The meet was broken down into six races, three for boys and three for girls. Foote won the Division III boys race in 16:49.1 while

### EA girls take own invite

The **East Aurora** girls cross country team placed three runners in the top 10 to win its own Invitational in a 13-team field. Honeoye Falls-Lima of Section V won the title among the 15 boys teams that participated.

Liz Deir of HF-L was medalist of the girls 5K race in 18:15. Jaime Wallace of **Alden** was runner-up. East Aurora placed Catherine Lusardi (third), Jenna Hulton (fourth) and Kristen Weberg (eighth) in the top 10.

Joe Whelan of **Hamburg** was the winner of the boys race in 15:31, beating Ryan O'Connor of **East Aurora** by 10 seconds. Josh Zubler of Frontier was third.

### Title for Lancaster girls volleyball

The **Lancaster** girls volleyball team went undefeated and had two players named to the all-

tournament team as it won the gold bracket at the **Sweet Home** Tournament. The Redskins went 4-0 in preliminary play and then fought off the host Panthers, 25-21, 25-15, in the championship match behind all-tourney picks Lindsay Schlegel and Danielle Martzolf.

"We came out really strong and led by six in the first game," said Sweet Home coach Breean Trapasso, "but then Lancaster served six points in a row and pulled away."

Others on the all-tournament team were: Krista Prentice (Sweet Home), Stephanie Kazmierczak (**City Honors**), Shannon Wilson (**North Tonawanda**) and Sam Newton (**Clarence**).
