North's combinations key win

Williamsville North only won three events in the Town of Amherst Track and Field Championships. But when the Spartans did win an event, they had a habit of doing so with 1- 2 finishes.

North won the boys' team title with 139 points, edging host **Amherst** by 12 points. The Spartans did it by capturing 54 points in the three events in which they delivered their devastating 1- 2 combination.

Greg Losi won the long jump and placed second in the triple jump while twin brother Matt Losi won the triple jump and placed second in the long jump. Kyle Siskon won the pole vault and was followed by Tom Colanora. Reid Jones also finished fifth in the pole vault for North in the meet, in which the top six finishers in each event earned points for their team.

Willie Jones of Amherst won the 100- meter dash and the high jump and ran anchor on the triumphant 400 relay team.

In the girls meet, Amherst won the final event to secure the meet championship. The Tigers edged second- place Williamsville North, 140.5- 130, as Allison Rogers won the 100 and 200 and also ran anchor on the winning 400 relay team that clinched the title. Brenna Symoniak won the 1,500 and 3,000 for Amherst, while Emily Curry won the high jump and discus for North.
