Records fall at Early Bird

Joe Whalen of Hamburg and Melissa Kurzdorfer of Lancaster walked away with two meet records each at the JFK Early Bird Track and Field meet on Saturday.

Despite temperatures in the mid- 40s, six boys records and six girls records fell during the eighth annual event.

Whalen set new marks in the 3,000-meter steeplechase (9:41.26) and the 3,200 (9:50.79) while Kurzdorfer broke her own meet records in the shot put (43 feet, 5 inches) and discus (124-3).

Other boys records were claimed by Anthony Johnson of Kenmore East in the 100 (10.94), Andrew Pfeiffer of Clarence in the 1,600 (4:29.14), Ron Golabek of Frontier in the shot put (55-11z) and the Clarence 4x800 relay (8:11.76).

North Tonawanda broke two records as Jackie Burns won the 400 (59.80) and the 4x400 relay crossed in

4:11.41. West Seneca West's 4x100 set a new standard in 50:15 and Miranda Melville of Rush-Henrietta went 7:59.85 in the 1,500 racewalk.

Lancaster won the large school team title by two points over Hamburg and Depew won the small schools. Lancaster's first places were by Ryan Pericozzi (triple), Scott Pezdek (discus) and the 4x100. The West Seneca West girls were the top large school and Iroquois claimed the small title.
